### SOURCE RELIABILITY

<b>A</b> COMPLETELY RELIABLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No doubt re authenticity, trustworthiness, competency.</li> <li>• History of complete reliability</li> </ul>
<b>B</b> USUALLY RELIABLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Some doubt re authenticity, trustworthiness, competency.</li> <li>• History of reliable information majority of the time.</li> </ul>
<b>C</b> FAIRLY RELIABLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Usually some doubt re authenticity, trustworthiness, competency.</li> <li>• History of reliable information some of the time.</li> </ul>
<b>D</b> NOT USUALLY RELIABLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Definite doubt re authenticity, trustworthiness, competency.</li> <li>• History of occasional reliability.</li> </ul>
<b>E</b> UNRELIABLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Great doubt re authenticity, trustworthiness, competency.</li> <li>• History of unreliable information.</li> </ul>
<b>F</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cannot be judged</li> </ul>

### DATA VALIDITY

<b>1</b> CONFIRMED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Confirmed by other independent sources.</li> <li>• Logical in itself</li> <li>• Agrees with other information on subject.</li> </ul>
<b>2</b> PROBABLY TRUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Not confirmed.</li> <li>• Logical in itself.</li> <li>• Agrees with other information on subject.</li> </ul>
<b>3</b> POSSIBLY TRUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Not confirmed.</li> <li>• Reasonably logical in itself.</li> <li>• Agree somewhat with other information on subject.</li> </ul>
<b>4</b> DOUBTFULLY TRUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Not confirmed.</li> <li>• Not illogical in itself.</li> <li>• Not believed at time of receipt although possible.</li> </ul>
<b>5</b> IMPROBABLE REPORT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The contrary is confirmed.</li> <li>• Is illogical in itself.</li> <li>• Contradicted by other information on subject.</li> </ul>
<b>6</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cannot be judged</li> </ul>
